3rd Sunday of odd numbered months
- **Hightower Beach, Satellite Beach:**  
4th Sunday of even numbered months
- **Seagull Park, Satellite Beach:**  
4th Sunday of odd numbered months
- **Coconut Point Beach (just north of Publix in Melbourne Beach):**  
5th Sunday of any month
